BSC INDOOR SOCCER REFEREE

JOB SUMMARY:

Soccer referees are on the field for every game, making calls and keeping players in check. They have a huge impact on the outcome of any given match, so they must always make good decisions.

Soccer referees must be able to think quickly on their feet and react to unpredictable situations. They need to know the rules of soccer inside and out, as well as how to properly apply them during each game they officiate.

REQUIREMENTS:

- **Communication:** They need to be able to communicate with players, coaches, and other referees. They also need to be able to communicate with the audience, explaining the rules of the game and the reasons for their decisions.
- **Decision-making:** They must be able to assess a situation and determine the appropriate course of action. For example, if a player is fouled, the referee must know whether the foul was intentional or not and whether the player was injured. The referee must then decide on whether a penalty kick is warranted. Making quick and accurate decisions can help keep the game moving and prevent players from getting frustrated.
- **Fitness:** Soccer referees need to be in good physical shape to keep up with the players on the field. They may also need to run to different areas of the field to make calls.
- **Knowledge of the rules:** Soccer referees need to have a thorough understanding of the rules of the game. They also need to know the rules so they can teach players and coaches about the rules of the game.
- **Must be 18 Years or Older:** BSC Indoor Adult Leagues run year-round and coincide with Youth Leagues in the Winter. Applicants must understand that they need to be able to officiate in either of these leagues.
- **Currently or Previously Play in A/B Level League.**

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Maintaining Concentration On The Game And Reacting Quickly To Rule Violations
- Keeping Track Of Time And Calling For Halftime Or Any Other Breaks In Play
- Making Sure That The Field Is Safe For Play, Including Checking For Holes, Ruts, Or Other Hazards On The Field
- Making Sure That All Players Are Familiar With The Rules Of The Game And Enforcing Penalties For Violations
- Assigning Penalties For Infractions, Misconduct, And Injuries As Needed
- Determining Whether A Kick Should Be Retaken Due To An Infraction Such As An Illegal Kick
- Determining Whether A Goal Has Been Scored, Whether There Was A Violation On The Play, And Signaling A Score Or A Violation With A Hand Gesture
- Calling Fouls And Misconduct On Players, Coaches, Or Spectators
- Recognizing When An Injury Requires That A Player Be Removed From The Field Or When A Player Appears To Be In Pain But Can Continue Playing
- Keep Records Of The Match
- Resolve Any Disputes Between Players
- Make Decisions On All Matters Related To The Game
